#### **Meeting Purpose**

The first meeting of the UTSA Area Planning Team aimed to accomplish these objectives: provide an overview of the UTSA Area Regional Center Plan project and timeline; describe potential outreach approach and get input on UTSA area-specific strategies; present a preview of existing conditions; discuss assets, challenges, and opportunities; and review next steps in the planning process.

## **Meeting Format**

The meeting began with a welcome by Mayor Ron Nirenberg and opening remarks from key City of San Antonio staff including Peter Zanoni, Deputy City Manager; Bridgett White, Director of the Department of City and Regional Planning; and Rudy Niño, Assistant Director of the Department of City and Regional Planning; as well as a project overview by Jay Renkens, MIG, Inc. planning consultant. Following this introductory presentation, Planning Team members and other participants broke into smaller Sub-Area based groups for focused discussions.

SA Tomorrow UTSA Area Regional Center Plan project managers Brenda Valadez and Mark De La Torre provided project context through a presentation of existing conditions within the UTSA Area Regional Center planning area, and then facilitated a Planning Team discussion. Mark De La Torre recorded comments from the UTSA Area session on a large wall graphic (see attached photo reduction).

## **UTSA Area Engagement Ideas**

Staff provided an overview of organizations who had been invited to participate in the UTSA Area Planning Team, as well as other stakeholders who have been identified and invited to participate in the regional center planning process. Participants provided the following suggestions for additional stakeholders to involve in the planning process and potential outreach strategies.

- Existing trees and open space
- Presence of large, conscientious employers
- The area is already a destination because of shopping, entertainment, educational, and natural amenities
- The view from the Eilan development
- UTSA and school pride

The following responses were provided by Planning Team Members who could not attend the kick-off meeting, but were able to provide input through a survey.

- Important to plan large undeveloped tracts in high-growth area
- Dove tail growth and development strategies with transportation plan





- Leveraging corporate, governmental, educational, and retail assets to ensure plan is truly comprehensive.
- Improve interchange
- Mixed-use communities, walkability
- Demographics
- Development of more housing choices for different income levels
- Easy access to medical services
- Diversification of transportation opportunities to relieve roadways and highways
- Greater connections of green spaces in surrounding areas to the Center
- Proximity to Leon Creek Greenway
- Camp Bullis
- Increasing development along 1604 E.
- UTSA for collaboration and research aids

### Issues/Challenges

The following issues and challenges were listed on a wall graphic and noted on a map of the regional center:

- Connectivity for all modes of transportation
- Protection of Military facilities and missions
- Tree canopy and green space preservation
- Access to transit and useful transit routes/express lines

The following responses were provided by Planning Team Members who could not attend the kick-off meeting, but were able to provide input through a survey.

- Growth and development is happening very rapidly
- Delicate balance of many different interests, e.g. large university (and need for housing/support services), established neighborhoods, industrial uses, recharge zone, and major highway intersection/gateway
- Funding
- Projected growth
- Developing over the Aquifer
- Vehicular dependency
- The lack of housing choices for different income levels, transportation options for people who either choose not to drive or don't own a car
- High property values and several large developments already underway under current standards. Potential for platting now to lock-in current standards.
- Lots of population turnover with move-ins and move-outs
